
Requirements for academics.html


- 1. The body element
 - 1.1. Must contain one header element.
 - 1.2. Must contain a section element providing an overview of your undergraduate studies (called the overview section see below).
 - 1.3. Must contain a section element for "Undergraduate Major Courses" (called a grouping section -- see below).
 - 1.4. Must contain a section element for "Other Undergraduate Courses" (called a grouping section).
 - 1.5. May contain a section element for "Graduate Courses" (called a grouping section).
 - 1.6. Must contain a footer element.

Figure 1 Structure of the body Element




- 2. The header element in the body element
 - 2.1. Must contain one img element.
 - 2.1.1. The src attribute must refer to a picture of you.
 - 2.2. Must contain one h1 element.
 - 2.2.1. The text must be your name.
 - 2.3. Must contain one h2 element.
 - 2.3.1. The text must be the literal "Academics".

Figure 2 Structure of the header Element




- 3. The overview section element
 - 3.1. Must contain one h1 element.
 - 3.1.1. The text must be the literal "Overview".
 - 3.2. Must contain one or more p elements.
 - 3.2.1. The text of the p elements must contain an overview of your undergraduate/graduate academic pursuits.

- 4. The grouping section elements
 - 4.1. Must have an h1 element.
 - 4.1.1.The text must be "Undergraduate Major Courses", "Other Undergraduate Courses", "Graduate Courses", or another appropriate descriptor.
 - 4.2. Must have one or more section elements of class course (see below).

- 5. The section elements of class course
 - 5.1. Must have one h1 element of class number.
 - 5.1.1. The text must be the course number (e.g., ECON111).
 - 5.2. Must have one h1 element of class title.
 - 5.2.1. The text must be the course title (e.g., Microeconomics).
 - 5.3. Must have one or more p elements.
 - 5.3.1. The text must be a description of the course and what you learned from it.

6. The footer Element

- 6.1. May contain an hr element.
- 6.2. Must contain a p element.
 - 6.2.1.It must begin with the literal "The courses above were taken at ".
 - 6.2.2.It must next have an a element for each relevant university.
 - 6.2.3.The a elements must be separated by appropriate connectives (e.g., commas, the literal "and").
 - 6.2.4.It must end with the literal ".".
